Call to Worship - Psalm 113

As many of you know, Antioch was named and planted specifically to be a church who blesses the nations. And we continue to have the desire and opportunity to that, by sending our people to the nations among us locally, and by sending our people literally to the nations around the world. And so occasionally we want our entire Sunday Gathering to be focused on God's global mission. We call them Sending Sundays.

So church hear the word of the Lord from Psalm 113 and say the underlined portions with me:

Praise the LORD! Praise, O servants of the LORD, praise the name of the LORD!

Congregation: Blessed be the name of the LORD from this time forth and forevermore!

From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the LORD is to be praised!

Congregation: The LORD is high above all nations, and his glory above the heavens!

Who is like the LORD our God, who is seated on high, who looks far down on the heavens and the earth? He raises the poor from the dust and lifts the needy from the ash heap, to make them sit with princes, with the princes of his people. He gives the barren woman a home, making her the joyous mother of children.

Congregation: Praise the LORD! [if they don't say it with oomph, have them say it again]

Let's remember, church, that we too are among those Gentile nations who have been called to praise the Lord through Jesus Christ. So let's add our voices to the mix!

All Creatures Of Our God And King

Confession - Acts 13:44-48

In Acts 13 we begin reading of two missionaries sent out from the church at Antioch, Paul and Barnabas, who began preaching the gospel to Gentiles. The story goes like this,

44 The next Sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord. 45 But when the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and began to contradict what was spoken by Paul, reviling him. 46 And Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, saying, "It was necessary that the word of God be spoken first to you. Since you thrust it aside and judge yourselves unworthy of eternal life, behold, we are turning to the Gentiles. 47 For so the Lord has commanded us, saying, "I have made you a light for the Gentiles, that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth.' " 48 And when the Gentiles heard this, they began rejoicing and glorifying the word of the Lord, and as many as were appointed to eternal life believed. Acts 13:44-48

As we pause this morning to confess our sins to the Lord together, let's acknowledge our human tendency to keep God's salvation for ourselves. Apart from the light of the Holy Spirit, we are tempted like the Jews to make God's kingdom a geopolitical kingdom, rather than extending it to the ends of the earth. Let's take a moment and confess in the spirit of this prayer:

Forgive us, Lord—our kingdoms are all so small. [brief pause]

Now let's pray this together:

Indwell us Lord and purify Our hands to work for you Enlist us Lord to serve nearby And across the waters too Your image bearers on the earth Will never know how much they're worth Unless we go and help them first And show the way to you. Amen.

On the night that he was betrayed, Jesus took bread, and after blessing it, he broke it and said to his disciples, "This is my body, which is broken for you; eat this in remembrance of me." He also took a cup of wine, and after blessing it, gave it to his disciples and said, "This cup is the new covenant marked by the shedding of my blood. For as often as you eat this bread and drink from this cup, you announce the Lord's death until he returns." Today we are announcing...

If you're not a Christian, this sacred symbol is not for you, but rather than taking communion, we encourage you to take Christ.
