Call to Worship - Patrick Roosa

Good morning and welcome to Antioch Church. My name is Patrick and I'm one of the pastors here. Hear the word of the Lord from Deuteronomy:

"For you are a people holy to the Lord your God. The Lord your God has chosen you to be a people for his treasured possession, out of all the peoples who are on the face of the earth. It was not because you were more in number than any other people that the Lord set his love on you and chose you, for you were the fewest of all peoples, but it is because the Lord loves you and is keeping the oath that he swore to your fathers, that the Lord has brought you out with a mighty hand and redeemed you from the house of slavery, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt." Deuteronomy 7:6-8

Like the people of Israel, God has chosen us as his family not because of anything special about us, but because of his great love. He has redeemed us from our slavery to sin so that we could belong to him alone. As the hymn says, "How deep the Father's love for us, how vast beyond all measure, that he should give his only Son, to make a wretch his treasure". From the very beginning of this gathering may you know that you are loved, and may that reality call you to worship.

How Deep The Father's Love For Us

We just sang, "I will not boast in anything, no gifts, no power, no wisdom, but I will boast in Jesus Christ, his death and resurrection". Now hear this word from 1 Corinthians:

"For consider your calling, brothers: not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption, so that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord." 1 Corinthians 1:26-31

When we focus on what we bring to the table to gain or keep God's love, we miss the whole point of it. But when we see it as a free gift of grace to those who bring nothing to the table, it leads us to boast in what God alone has done. As the New City Catechism says:

Church, what is our only hope in life and death?

Let's confess this together:

That we are not our own but belong to God.
