For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us, that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the Glory of your Name. Amen.

Good morning church, you may be seated. If you don't know me, my name is Patrick, one of the pastors here, Antioch kids you will hang with us for a few mintues please. Some Sunday's we have the privilege of hearing a pastor pray before the preaching, but we also from time to time celebrate an evidence of grace. This morning we have the privilege to celebrate a grace among us, parent-child dedication.

For those of you who are unfamiliar with what dedication is, it is a symbolic commitment of the parents to raise their children in the discipline and instruction of the Lord, which is an extension of the Great Commission and a continuation of what Moses spoke to Israel in the desert. Hear what Moses has to say in Deuteronomy 6:4-9,

"Hear, O Israel: The Lord our god, the Lord is one. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates."

This charge from Moses was to encourage the people of Israel to keep the Lord their God before them always and to raise up the next generation to understand what it had been like to be enslaved in Egypt and to see the mighty power of God bring them out by a cloud by day, and a pillar of fire by night, lest they forget. Likewise parents, you have been endowed with a task that is not unlike that of the ancient Israelites. You are to help your children to understand what it was like to live as an unbeliever, and how the strong arm of the Lord saved you and made you his own and is continuing to do a good work in you.

So to bring some clarity to an often questionable practice in the church, dedication is a symbolic act between the church and its members that have children. That we, the church, are committing to pray for, disciple, and encourage parents and their children in the covenant community and that parents are making a commitment before the church to receive the prayer, discipleship, and encouragement while raising their children in the nurture and instruction of the Lord. Dedication does not save your children., only grace through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Dedication does not guarantee their salvation when they get older either, it only points to what the proverbs say that we should raise our children in the way that they should go and that when they are older they might not depart from it.

To pray for these families on a regular basis for the health of their marriages and for their children to know Christ at an early age.

If you receive this charge and by God's grace seek to be faithful to it, say, "We do." [We do.] You may be seated.

As a gift to each of you as parents the church has bought you a book to read. Our encouragement to you is to continue to grow through reading, discussion, and encouraging one another. Healthy parenting is a partnership as we work together to raise our children. I will now pray to our Father. Join me in prayer.
