Call to Worship - 2 Corinthians 4:4-6

Good morning and welcome to Antioch Church! Let's begin today's gathering with this word from 2 Corinthians:

In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. 2 Corinthians 4:4-6

Have you ever thought about the fact that calling people to worship is actually audacious? Who are we to say what people should worship? Well, the reason why we can call ourselves and others to worship, is because it is a response to the most significant acts that God has accomplished in human history: not something far off in a heavenly realm, but something right here on earth. We have seen God's face in the Person of Jesus Christ. So let's respond to this light by lifting our own faces and worshiping the risen Christ...

Confession - 1 John 1:1, 3

For our confession today listen to these words from the Apostle John:

That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life... that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. 1 John 1:1, 3

It is based on historical fact by those who were eyewitnesses to God's work in the world. That, too, is audacious to the world. But let us confess this together, which is at the top our beliefs statement as a church:
