Oh Give Thanks (Psalm 107)

Call to Worship - Psalm 107:1-9

Good morning and welcome to Antioch! My name is Lydia and I'm one of the worship leaders here. Church, hear the Word of the Lord from Psalm 107, and let it call us to worship this morning:

1 Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good,

for his steadfast love endures forever!

2 Let the redeemed of the Lord say so,

whom he has redeemed from trouble

3 and gathered in from the lands,

from the east and from the west,

from the north and from the south.

4 Some wandered in desert wastes,

finding no way to a city to dwell in;

5 hungry and thirsty,

their soul fainted within them.

6 Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress.

7 He led them by a straight way

till they reached a city to dwell in.

8 Let them thank the Lord for his steadfast love,

for his wondrous works to the children of man!

9 For he satisfies the longing soul,

and the hungry soul he fills with good things. Psalm 107:1-9

Today, we'll hear how God uses those he saves to participate in his kingdom work. His love and his mercy lead us to obedience, humility, and sacrifice. We can be joyful in these things as we recognize that he is the Steadfast Redeemer who has called many to himself, and feeds our longing, hungry souls. and the waves of the sea were hushed.

30 Then they were glad that the waters were quiet,

and he brought them to their desired haven.

Please mark this change and look for the link to the Zoom call in the Sunday follow up! As pastor Jason mentioned in the sermon this is a vital part of being a sent one. In MCT we advocate and pray and bring the needs of our sent ones to the attention of the body and the needs of the body to the sent one. If you are interested in being a part of this ministry let Pastor Robbie or any one of the pastors know so that we can get you connected!

We begin each gathering with a Call to Worship and we end with a Benediction, which is simply a reminder that we are blessed to be a blessing. If you would like to receive this benediction, I invite you to open your hands before you.
