Call to Worship - Deuteronomy 8:2-3

Good morning and welcome to Antioch Church! As we enter into this gathering with words from our week lingering in our hearts and minds, let's reset by giving our attention to the words of God. Listen to what he says to his people whom he had allowed to wander in the wilderness for forty years:

And you shall remember the whole way that the Lord your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, that he might humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep his commandments or not. And he humbled you and let you hunger and fed you with manna, which you did not know, nor did your fathers know, that he might make you know that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord. Deuteronomy 8:2-3

You may be here today satisfied and sustained by God's words to you this week. Or perhaps you're here hungry and unfulfilled, wondering how long you're going to wander. Either way, God is calling to you afresh to be nourished by the Word that has come from him—the living Word, Jesus Christ. This Word always comes through, so let's sing to him...

For those who are in Christ, hear this good news from Hebrews 4:

For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. Hebrews 4:15-16

But in order for that to be good news, we first must acknowledge that we are sinners daily given to temptation, and often failing. Let's pray this together:

Almighty God, whose blessed Son was led by the Spirit to be tempted by Satan,

Congregation: come quickly to help us who are assaulted by many temptations;

Congregation: let each of us find you mighty to save;

through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen. (from the Daily Prayer app)

Evidence of Grace - John 17:22-23

You may be seated. Good morning, my name is Brad and I'm one of the pastors here. Sometimes in our Sunday Gathering we like to share an Evidence of Grace, this is something in the life of our church that is either a tangible expression of God's grace or a deep need for God's grace. For today, it's kind of both.

Almost exactly one year ago COVID-19 entered into our lives. And it has been a wild ride. Our church has walked through:

- sickness
- quarantine
- isolation
- virtual meetings
- job loss
- fear
- anxiety
- tension
- conflict

We must take a moment and recognize that it's only by God's grace that we arrive here together today.

As your pastors we also want to acknowledge two things that are struggling to co-exist. First, that this pandemic is not yet over. But second, that all of us are over it. We are tired of wearing masks and social distancing and zoom calls and being isolated from one another. And we recognize, especially in our current cultural climate, that this has the potential for major conflict among us.

Something that we think would be helpful for you to know, is that we as a plurality of pastors have not always held all the same views regarding COVID-19 and our response to it. And that means we have had to pursue intentional gospel relationships, spending hours seeking to understand one another and discerning together the best steps for our church. This we believe is the best way forward for us all: not to cancel each other or categorize each other, but to talk to each other and listen to each other.

We have also revisited the COVID-19 guidelines we set when reopening last summer. We will be reposting them on our facebook page and our website. As you might have noticed, there are parts of those guidelines that have already begun to fade—such as, we are serving coffee again, we are mobilizing greeters again, and we no longer require the use of only one entrance and one exit. We would also like to announce that we are changing the language of our guideline related to masks. Rather than "requiring" them, we are now "requesting" them when entering, exiting, and moving about the building. In doing this we ask that you not be flippant, but thoughtful, and prepared to talk with one another about your differences in the same way we have as pastors.

Our hearts' desire is that we would not get so close to what seems like the finish line of this pandemic, and then implode in our relationships with one another. We want to continue being a body who reflects unity in diversity, that we may be one even as the triune God is one, so that the world may know that Jesus has come and that he loves us. To that end, let's pray.
