Today's word of assurance was written by one of our distributed members serving in the Middle East. She writes to us,

Hear the word of the Lord from Psalm 46:

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Psalm 46:1

Suffering is suffering, regardless of what country you're in. It is unfair to compare and belittle what you're feeling, because it is very real to you. The entire world is suffering. It is ok to mourn the loss of comfort as long as it turns you back to the Father.

Take heart in knowing your brothers and sisters in Christ around the world are mourning the loss of their comfort as well. Many of them here cannot return to their home countries, because they will be imprisoned or even killed; their families have disowned them for leaving their former faith to embrace life with Christ; they have lost their jobs, because their employer does not want to employ Christians; many are homeless; yet they count it all joy to share in the sufferings of Christ.

I know suffering because of a global pandemic is different from suffering for your faith. I also do not mean to compare different forms of suffering. I just want to encourage with this: our brothers and sisters in the East have modeled how to suffer well, and we will do well to follow their examples. They praise God in the midst of it, knowing he will be glorified even when they can't see it.

Therefore we will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling. There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved; God will help her when morning dawns. Psalm 46:2-5
