Call to Worship - Psalm 18:23; 32:6

Good morning and welcome to Antioch Church! Once again we gather here together, and it seems there are so many stressful things happening in our lives and world. The news brings bad news, our phones buzz constantly, bidding us come to something else that would distract us, and our hearts are tired and heavy. In the midst of this, we need a rock that is higher than the flood around us. So take in these words from the Psalms (and say the underlined portion with me):

The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, my God, my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold.

Congregation: I call upon the LORD, who is worthy to be praised, and I am saved from my enemies.

Therefore let everyone who is godly offer prayer to you at a time when you may be found; surely in the rush of great waters, they shall not reach him. Psalm 18:2-3; 32:6

Wherever you are today, the godly response to the flood of life is not to get it together, but to carry our tired and heavy hearts up onto the rock that is the Lord. In our worship today let's call upon him while he still may be found...
