Genesis 25-36: Learning to Limp

Call to Worship - Hosea 12:3-6

Well church, it's the middle of the summer, and many of us are checked out, burned out, or sweated out (maybe all three!). But today we are arriving at the most important part of our sermon series in the story of Jacob. So I want to call you to check back in, to move your heart from ready-to-chill to ready-to-wrestle. There is something the Spirit wants to do today. The prophet Hosea says this of Jacob and the people that came from him, Israel:

- 3 In the womb he took his brother by the heel, and in his manhood he strove with God.
- 4 He strove with the angel and prevailed; he wept and sought his favor.

He met God at Bethel,

and there God spoke with us-

- 5 the Lord, the God of hosts,
- the Lord is his memorial name:
- 6 "So you, by the help of your God, return, hold fast to love and justice, and wait continually for your God." Hosea 12:3-6

I know summer is the time to take it easy, but by the help of your God, return and wait for him right now. Instead of it just being another Sunday, let's face our foes today, and win.

Confession - John 15:1-2

In the Gospel of John we read these famous words of Jesus:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. 2 Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. John 15:1-2

This is really easy to miss: Jesus tells us here that the way he helps his followers to grow is by pruning them—that means literally cutting things away from them. Church, if we don't admit that this is a normal part of the Christian life, then when God starts cutting, we'll start running.

In just a moment we're going to be admitting this together in the form of a song. It's a song we've never sung at Antioch. It was written by John Newton, the same man who wrote Amazing Grace. The story goes that his close friend and fellow pastor William Cowper was in the midst of yet another deep pit of depression, and Newton wondered how God could start cutting again on a man who loved him so much. This raw and yet beautiful hymn was the answer. I want to read these lyrics to you before we sing:

I asked the Lord that I might grow In faith and love and ev'ry grace, Might more of His salvation know, And seek more earnestly His face.

'Twas He who taught me thus to pray, And He, I trust, has answered prayer, But it has been in such a way As almost drove me to despair.

I hoped that in some favored hour At once He'd answer my request And, by His love's constraining pow'r, Subdue my sins and give me rest.

Instead of this, He made me feel The hidden evils of my heart And let the angry pow'rs of hell Assault my soul in ev'ry part.

Yea, more with His own hand He seemed Intent to aggravate my woe, Crossed all the fair designs I schemed, Humbled my heart and laid me low.

"Lord, why is this," I trembling cried;
"Wilt Thou pursue Thy worm to death?"
"Tis in this way," the Lord replied,
"I answer prayer for grace and faith."

"These inward trials I employ From self and pride to set thee free And break thy schemes of earthly joy That thou may'st find thy all in Me."
