0:00 Call to Worship - John 12:12-13; Zechariah 9:9

Happy Palm Sunday to you! On this day we kick off what the church has historically called Holy Week. Here we remember and celebrate the final week leading up to the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It begins today with Palm Sunday, the day when Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem as a suffering servant King.

As a picture of just how broken our world is, the people who cried out "Hosanna!" (which means "save us") would be the same ones who days later would cry out "Crucify him!" And yet we come reflecting the same irony: we are sinners in need of a Savior; we are people gathered to worship who have struggled at times to worship throughout the week. So let us shake off the sins and distractions that so easily entangle us, and let's welcome our King once again! Recall the words of the Scriptures:

12 The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. 13 So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" John 12:12-13

Let us respond with our own shout of praise:

Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!

The Scriptures continue,

Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he, humble and mounted on a donkey. Zechariah 9:9

Let us respond with this prayer:

In praise we adore you, King Jesus! Enter our hearts today Even as you entered Jerusalem long ago. Amen!

Church, Palm Sunday not only points us to Jesus' first coming as a suffering servant King, but also to his second coming as a conquering warrior King. We see this connection in Psalm 96:

11 Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice; let the sea roar, and all that fills it; 12 let the field exult, and everything in it! Then shall all the trees of the forest sing for joy 13 before the Lord, for he comes, for he comes to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness, and the peoples in his faithfulness. Psalm 96:11-13

In acknowledgement that the King is coming soon, let's confess this to him together:

O Lord, we confess our hands are not clean, our hearts are not pure. We confess that the mouths that seek to praise you often deny or defy you. We confess that the hands that seek to serve you often become fists.

Forgive our spiritual sleepiness and make us ready for your return.

You who behold him, and choose to be cut to the heart today rather than waiting until the day he returns, hear this:

Blessed are those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes. Truly, I say to you, he will dress himself for service and have them recline at table, and he will come and serve them. Luke 12:37
