Confession

Show of hands, how many people in here like to wait for things? Whether you're pulling up as the last car in the packed Chick-fil-A drive thru or you're 70th in line at the county clerks office, if most of us are honest with ourselves, there is something about having to wait for things that leaves us with a profound sense of frustration and injustice.

Now imagine you're the disciples, Jesus is ascending to his rightful place at the right hand of the Father and they ask him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the Kingdom of Israel?" And what does Jesus say? "It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority."

Uhhhh huh? No definitive yes or no? No timetable? No real sign to look for? Imagine what that must have felt like. Take a moment and confess before God a time when you asked God for a specific answer, and when He chose not to give it to you, your immediate response was more questioning and anger.

However, Jesus's answer to the disciples doesn't stop there. He concludes by saying, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." Our perfect Creator has perfect timing. His call to us is the same as his call to the disciples, not to spend our time worrying about when he will return, but to be faithful till that time to share the good news of the gospel everywhere that we go by the power of the Holy Spirit.

So when you find yourself in a season or a moment of waiting, consider how God may be using that time to help you grow in faith and learn to be a more faithful follower of Him.
