Call to Worship - Psalm 100:1-5

This morning we are continuing our Antioch Family series entitled "I Am Not My Own" and today we are giving attention to an important and easily overlooked part of the church: singles.

Whether single or not, in our culture we see the fierce fight for independence raised up on a pedestal; and if we're honest, we can often see it in our own hearts. All it takes is a moment's inconvenience to grumble to ourselves, "No one tells me what to do!"

Let's take a moment to recognize and refocus on the Lord, the One to whom we belong, and give praise to him. Read the underlined portions with me, from Psalm 100.

1 Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.

- 2 Worship the Lord with gladness;
- come before him with joyful songs.

3 Know that the Lord is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.

4 Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name.
5 For the Lord is good and his love endures forever;

his faithfulness continues through all generations. Psalm 100:1-5

Lord, you tell us what to do. And we are so glad!

God is Good

Confession - 2 Corinthians 5:16-17, 21

Church, our world's battle for independence may look like outright rebellion against God, but if we pause we can see that even for those of us in Christ, we can be tempted to want to do things our own way too. What do I mean by that? Do you feel the pressure to be a "super Christian" or even just a "good Christian"? Do you tend to think, "Next time I won't do this or say that—I'll do better"?

When we tell ourselves to straighten up and do better, what we're really saying is, "I can be good all on my own. I can be presentable to God and do it my own way." And that forgets God's gift of grace!

Brothers and sisters, let's take a moment to confess to the Lord where we have relied on our own strength to do better.

Now hear the good news of what Christ has done to make us not just better, but completely acceptable to God:

From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh...if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.

God made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God. 2 Corinthians 5:16-17, 21
