0:00 Call to Worship - Isaiah 43:1, 4-7

We live in a world where many different winds of doctrine come our way on a daily basis. These doctrines try to tell us the way to the good life. For example, some say the way to the good life is by remaining single so that you'll be free to do whatever you want. Others say the way to the good life is by getting married so that you'll never be alone. But even though marriage and singleness can be part of the good life, neither of them are ultimate; neither of them fully define who we are; neither of them can satisfy the deepest needs of our souls.

Thankfully, there is an anchor of doctrine that points us to the truly good life. It begins with the one true God who created us for himself. Hear the word of the Lord from Isaiah 43, where God spoke of his Old Testament people, but can now be applied to all who follow Jesus Christ:

But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. Because you are precious in my eyes, and honored, and I love you, I give men in return for you, peoples in exchange for your life. Fear not, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you. I will say to the north, Give up, and to the south, Do not withhold; bring my sons from afar and my daughters from the end of the earth, 7 everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made." Isaiah 43:1, 4-7

Whether you are here today single, married, divorced, or widowed, we all enter the world alone, and we all will depart it alone; we will all feel different measures of the kind of aloneness that God himself declared is not good. But here's what IS good, and worthy of our worship today: that we were made to be with God, and he wants to be with us, and he is enough to satisfy the deepest needs of our souls.

Church, because we regard marriage so highly in a world that does not, sometimes we give off the vibe that marriage is the pinnacle of the Christian life. And yet we follow a Savior who embodied perfect humanity—as a single person. That means both marriage and singleness are completely viable ways to live as followers of Jesus; and that the pinnacle of the gospel is to be fully united to Christ forever. Read this good news for yourself from Revelation 19:

6 Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the roar of many waters and like the sound of mighty peals of thunder, crying out, "Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns. 7 Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his Bride has made herself ready; Revelation 19:6-7

Marriage is a beautiful sign that points us to the SHAPE of the gospel. And singleness is a beautiful sign that points us to the SUFFICIENCY of the gospel. So rather than confessing that temporary, earthly things are what we live for, let's anchor our hearts in the great wedding to come, by confessing this eternal pinnacle for all who believe (from Revelation 19):

Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb. Revelation 19:9
