Text - Luke 5:1-11

Title - The Fisher of Men

Main idea - God chooses his people to participate in his kingdom work of drawing many to himself.

Outline

- 1) Be obedient to God's instruction - Luke 5:4-7
- 2) Be humble in your confession - Luke 5:8-9
- 3) Be sacrificial in your commission - Luke 5:10-11

Questions

As an alternative to the usual format of discussion questions, consider dividing into groups of men and women and sharing more in depth than just a single Evidence of Grace. Discuss what's been happening in one another's lives not just externally, but internally. Confess sins to one another, speak truth to one another, and pray for one another.

—or—

- 1) Icebreaker - What's it like for you to think about some of our most important leaders and beloved members (such as the Crigler family) being sent out?
- 2) Context - (Transition: this passage teaches us about how Jesus sends all of us out.)
Read Luke 5:1-3. How do you see Jesus using ordinary means to call ordinary people? Why does that matter?
- 3) Read Luke 5:4-7. Here Jesus asks Peter to obey in a way that didn't make sense? How have you experienced that? Are you experiencing it now?
- 4) Read Luke 5:8-9. Why do you think Peter reacted this way? How does it instruct us? (It may be helpful to reference Isaiah 6:5.)
- 5) Application - Read Luke 5:10-11. Who has God put on your heart to be praying for and reaching out to for Easter? Like the disciples, what sacrifice will it require for you to do so?
