Confession

We are 3 weeks into January and for some, it may already feel like it's going to be a difficult year. The small things feel like monumental disasters, and the big things feel like another drop in the bucket for whatever is sure to follow. In these moments we often feel the inclination to pull away from God's promises rather than cling tightly to them. St. Augustine once said, "You never go away from us, yet we have difficulty in returning to You." Our prayers and actions become less about moving closer to God and more about checking off a to-do list of things we hope might make us feel a little better.

Have you ever found yourself in this place? Maybe it's right now, maybe it was a long time ago, or maybe you just found your way out of it.

Take a moment to quiet your heart before God, and bring him this question:
