Call to Worship - Matthew 12:18-21

There are those other moments when I cannot sense you near, Cannot hear you, see you, touch you, time when fear or depression or frustation overwhelm When the seawalls of my faith crumble and give way to inrushing tides of doubt.

So now church, when those moments come, let's join with the man in the scripture who cried out to the Lord:

We ask and confess: "Lord I believe! Help me with my unbelief!"

And with Simon Peter we join:

"Lord, where else will we go? You have the words of eternal life".
