0:00 Call to Worship - John 17:20-23

According to the early church calendar, the Sunday following Pentecost is traditionally celebrated as Trinity Sunday. While every Sunday gathering is a celebration of the Trinity, Trinity Sunday focuses explicitly on the mystery, power, and beauty of the triune God. Our Christian identity and mission are given to us as we are baptized and sent in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Our worship is not only directed to God the Father, but is also enabled by the prompting of the Holy Spirit and the mediation of Jesus Christ. When we as God's people gather with unity in diversity, we are declaring and reflecting the glorious reality of the holy Trinity. In fact, let's say this together from our church's doctrinal statement:

Congregation: We believe God exists eternally in trinity; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Hear the words of Jesus as he prayed for you in John 17:

20 "I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, 21 that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. 22 The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, 23 I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me. John 17:20-23

Now let's make his prayer our prayer as we worship together this morning:

Holy, holy, holy God, we worship and adore you—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Today in our worship we long for a glimpse of your glory, seen perfectly in Christ, our Lord. As we worship, may we gain new insight about the mystery and wonder of your love. And may we sense new ways to mirror that love in our world, through Christ, our Lord. And all God's people said, Amen.

0:00 Confession - Hebrews 12:5-11

Hear the word of the Lord from Hebrews 12:5-11:

5 And have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons? "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by him. 6 For the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives." 7 It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline? 8 If you are left without discipline, in which all have participated, then you are illegitimate children and not sons. 9 Besides this, we have had earthly fathers who disciplined us and we respected them. Shall we not much more be subject to the Father of spirits and live? 10 For they disciplined us for a short time as it seemed best to them, but he disciplines us for our good, that we may share his holiness. 11 For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it. Hebrews 12:5-11

Church, God's discipline comes to us as a loving gift in a confounding package. As we'll see in today's story in Genesis, it is often worked out like the process of sun and frost: the hot and the cold, the ups and the downs of life, are meant to lead us to confess our need for God. This process is hard to endure, and it is reflected in the song we're about to sing. So let's use the chorus of this song to confess our need and our hope:

Congregation: In the harvest feast or the fallow ground My certain hope is in Jesus found My lot, my cup, my portion sure Whatever comes, we shall endure Whatever comes, we shall endure

Take this to heart: when God's beloved children endure the temporary pain of his loving discipline, they will grow up and flourish. Let's sing and believe it together.
