Call to Worship - 2 Samuel 22:2-7

Church, it is easy to hide behind the false comfort of "thumbs-up-ism." That's when someone asks you how you are doing and you give them a big thumbs up and say "doing great!"

Yet life is difficult and we are faced daily by trials, sufferings, and the simple realities of a fallen world. But thanks be to God, that we don't have to hide ourselves from him. We can enter his presence with our whole being. He knows us. We can raise our voices in lament and cry out to him. He hears us.

Receive this call to worship from 2 Samuel 22:2-7, and read the underlined portion aloud together

The Lord is your rock and your fortress and your deliverer, your God, your rock, in whom you take refuge,

your shield, and the horn of your salvation, your stronghold and your refuge,

your savior; he saves you from violence.

We call upon the Lord, who is worthy to be praised.

Our lives are faced with sufferings and trials We have lost loved ones. We are sick and weary. Anxieties consume us. Our sin oppresses us. We are confronted with the realities of this life.

In our distress we call upon the Lord our God And from his temple he hears our voice, and our cries come to his ears.

Let's worship him together.

Confession - 2 Corinthians 13:5

In Isaiah chapter 55, the prophet describes Jesus Christ, the suffering servant of the Lord, as one who is acquainted with our grief. He knows the different burdens we carry, he understands the things you struggle with. Take a moment now to silently confess a burden, struggle, or grief to the Lord.

Brief silence is kept.

Receive this confession and say the underlined portions aloud:

We confess our hesitancy to fully acknowledge such grief for fear that it might overwhelm us

But it is through grief that you remind us, Lord, there is something of worth to our souls. And the loss of a worthy thing hurts

Yet you are not a Father who scolds his child when her balloon floats away, but, rather, draws her into your arms because you measure her losses not by your standards, but hers.

**So by our trust of you we take the risk of unwrapping before you our aching hearts

For as we share abundantly in Christ's sufferings, so through Christ we share abundantly in comfort too.** From 2 Corinthians 13:5
