Genesis 37-50: Worst Thing, Best Thing

0:00 Call to Worship - 1 Chronicles 16:28-36

It may not seem like it, but every time we gather as a church, it is a form of protest. We are declaring that evil and death, suffering and loss, sorrow and tears will not have the final word. We are refusing the lie that God is good only when life is good. Instead, we come defiantly clinging to God's words about himself rather than our own words.

So let us prepare our hearts and minds and bodies for this joyful protest, by quoting at length from 1 Chronicles 16. And if you believe them, speak the underlined portions with me:

28 Ascribe to the Lord, O families of the peoples, ascribe to the Lord glory and strength!
29 Ascribe to the Lord the glory due his name; bring an offering and come before him!

Worship the Lord in the splendor of holiness;

30 tremble before him, all the earth; yes, the world is established; it shall never be moved.

31 Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice, and let them say among the nations, "The Lord reigns!" 32 Let the sea roar, and all that fills it;

let the field exult, and everything in it!

33 Then shall the trees of the forest sing for joy

before the Lord, for he comes to judge the earth.

34 Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever!

35 Say also:

Congregation:

"Save us, O God of our salvation, and gather and deliver us from among the nations, that we may give thanks to your holy name and glory in your praise. 36 Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting!"

Then all the people said, "Amen!" and praised the Lord. 1 Chronicles 16:28-36

0:00 Confession - James 5:16

In the book of James we are commanded,

Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective. James 5:16

Even in the course of a normal week, all of us at times sin against and wound others, by things we have done, and things we have left undone. This often reflects the very opposite of God's character: merciless, graceless, quick to anger, and abounding in selfishness and neglect. Where have you wounded another this week?

Even if the Holy Spirit brings nothing specific to mind at this time, I invite you to make this your prayer for the proper time:

I confess, O God, that I have wounded another, and for this I repent.

Even as you used for good what Joseph's brothers had intended for evil, O Lord, so may the painful consequences I have set in motion in the lives of others be somehow redeemed by your providence.

For their sake, O Lord, grant them the grace of true forgiveness and the freedom that would follow from it.
Let them continue their journey toward you unhindered.

And let me rise from this conviction and confession wiser in my faith, more intentional in my love for others, less likely to choose the dried husk of selfishness when next tempted toward sin.

Forgive me, O Lord, lest I despair. Restore me, lest I be far from you. For your pardon alone is sufficient for our healing. Amen.
