Call to Worship - Matthew 5:3-6

Church, how we approach worship matters. We can easily get stuck in the routine of merely "showing up." Or we may enter worship, as one theologian puts it, "on superstitious terms, as if we are hedging our bets with God." But this is not truly Christian worship.

Christian worship is centered around the audacious belief that Jesus Christ has first called us to himself, that the God of the universe wants to meet with us.

Hear these words of welcome from the Gospel of Matthew:

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied. Matthew 5:3-6

Thus we say on behalf of Christ:

You who are poor, you who mourn, you who are meek, and you who hunger and thirst,

Come and worship and be blessed!

Church, every time we encounter the Lord in his word, we are invited to humble ourselves in trust and obedience. In the prophet Joel we read.

"Yet even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning, and rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the LORD your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. Joel 2:12-13

True to the season of Lent, let us not be like the one who hears and goes away sad, unwilling to obey. Instead, let us humble ourselves and confess our sins to the only One who is able to save. Let's speak these righteous words of the tax collector:

God, be merciful to me, a sinner! Luke 18:13

Brothers and sisters, this is our true confession and great comfort (say it with me):

Jesus Christ came into the world to save sinners. 1 Timothy 1:15
