0:00 Call to Worship - Psalm 105:1-2, 5-6, 16-22
 It's an exciting day as we return to our journey through the book of Genesis from the past three years. As we begin to walk together through the story of Joseph, let's prepare our hearts and minds. Let's allow God himself to call us to worship through his ancient and yet living word. Say this with me:

 \*\*1 Oh give thanks to the Lord; call upon his name;

make known his deeds among the peoples! 2 Sing to him, sing praises to him; tell of all his wondrous works!\*\* Psalm 105:1-2

The psalmist then goes on to tell of one of these works. Listen to the Lord's deeds:

16 When he summoned a famine on the land and broke all supply of bread,
17 he had sent a man ahead of them,
Joseph, who was sold as a slave.
18 His feet were hurt with fetters; his neck was put in a collar of iron;
19 until what he had said came to pass, the word of the Lord tested him.
20 The king sent and released him; the ruler of the peoples set him free;
21 he made him lord of his house and ruler of all his possessions,
22 to bind his princes at his pleasure and to teach his elders wisdom. Psalm 105:16-22

Just as Joseph was set free from slavery to declare God's wondrous works, we the church have been set free to declare them as well. So let's declare this together:

\*\*5 Remember the wondrous works that he has done, his miracles, and the judgments he uttered,
6 O offspring of Abraham, his servant, children of Jacob, his chosen ones!\*\* Psalm 105:5-6

### 0:00 Confession - Lamentations 3:52-54

In the book of Lamentations we read the words of the prophet Jeremiah, another man who was thrown into a pit like Joseph. He says,

52 "I have been hunted like a bird by those who were my enemies without cause;
53 they flung me alive into the pit and cast stones on me;
54 water closed over my head;
I said, 'I am lost.' Lamentations 3:52-54

Probably none of us have been literally cast into a pit recently. But it is often true that the harder we pursue God's dreams for our lives, the more difficult things come our way, and often all at once. It can leave us in a spiritual pit, despairing, confused, and feeling abandoned.

This is unusual for Antioch, but I want to invite everyone to close their eyes for a moment. If you have been in a spiritual pit recently, and especially if you are in one right now, raise your hand. This is not so that anyone can see or so the pastors can come talk to you; this is only for the Lord to see; it's a simple way to cry for help from the pit. Now open your eyes and say this with me:

\*\*55 "I called on your name, O Lord, from the depths of the pit;
56 you heard my plea,
'Do not close your ear to my cry for help!'
57 You came near when I called on you;
you said, 'Do not fear!'\*\* Lamentations 3:55-57

This next song is a hard song to sing, but it is a cry from the pit. It's a way of declaring that Jesus is Lord even over the worst things in our lives.
