0:00 Call to Worship - Deuteronomy 6:4-12, 20-25

One of the things you'll quickly notice about Antioch is how God has gifted us with so many children and parents. And not only that, but people who desire to be parents by waiting on the Lord and by walking through foster and adoption processes. In fact, children make up well over one third of this congregation (you really notice it when much of the room empties at the time we dismiss Antioch Kids to their classes!). When we declare our aim to "pursue intentional gospel relationship that display Christ's glory among the nations", remember—those relationships include these children.

So as we draw near to God in worship today, let's come thanking him for such gifts, and asking for his help to steward them well. Deuteronomy 6 calls us to worship in this way:

4 "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. 5 You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. 6 And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. 7 You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. 8 You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. 9 You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates. Deuteronomy 6:4-9

Lord, as we consider these children,
Congregation: Let us not forget you, who graciously gave them to us.

Lord, when our sons and daughters ask us in time to come,
"What is the meaning of the commands that our God has given us?"
Help us to respond,
Congregation: "To fear him who brought us out of slavery to sin."
(Adapted from Deuteronomy 6:10-12, 20-25)

0:00 Confession - Psalm 62:5-6, 8, 11-12

In the story of Joseph we often get the sense that he has to wait for "some time"—no definition, no sense of change coming soon. We don't usually handle it well when we're in a painful situation and God's purpose for it seems to last for "some time". Often instead of finding peace with God in the waiting, we prolong the waiting by believing that peace will come only when change comes.

But we can be honest in worship today: sometimes we distrust and dislike waiting on the Lord. So let's make our confession to him from Psalm 62:

8 Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before him; God is a refuge for us. Selah

Congregation: 5 For God alone, O my soul, wait in silence, for my hope is from him. 6 He only is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be shaken.

11 Once God has spoken; twice have I heard this: that power belongs to God, 12 and that to you, O Lord, belongs steadfast love. For you will render to a man according to his work.

Congregation: 5 For God alone, O my soul, wait in silence, for my hope is from him. 6 He only is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be shaken.
