October 8, 2023 - Blessed to be a Blessing, 2 Corinthians 4:7-18 - Tanner Williams

Call to Worship - Psalm 139: 13-16

Good morning church. Each week in our family groups we talk about evidences of God's grace that we've seen in our lives. I'd like you for just a moment to quiet your heart, and think back this past week on a situation where you saw God's clear presence in your life. It could be a difficult situation or a joy-filled moment. Whatever it is, think on it now.

Now consider that since the creation of the world, God was always going to be present in that moment of your life. He planned on the most intimate level to intervene in that situation, at just the right time, since before he spoke the first ray of sunlight into existence.

Hear these words from Psalm 139 verses 13-16:

For you formed my inward parts; you knitted me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well. My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth. Your eyes saw my unformed substance; in your book were written, every one of them, the days that were formed for me, when as yet there was none of them.

So let us sing together this morning, not only remembering God's work in our life right now, but worshiping the promises and blessings he promised to fulfill since before we were knit together.

Behold Our God

Confession - Matthew 5:3-11

In the midst of our busy lives and those days where it just feels like one thing after another, we can quickly doubt and even forget the life altering truth of God's blessings on our lives. Yet, how fortunate are we that our sovereign Creator knew the doubts we would face, and offered us these blessings from the mouth of Jesus:

When we don't feel worthy of God's love

Let's respond together:

3 "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

When the suffering of the world feels to heavy to bear

4 "Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

When it feels like our lives are too insignificant 5 "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.

When we don't feel like we've done enough for the kingdom 6 "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.

When we struggle to forgive past hurt 7 "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy.

When we feel like we haven't experienced the world enough to be a faithful witness 8 "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.

When we battle the desire to respond in anger because of disagreements 9 "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.

When we worry that following Jesus too closely may lead to painful situations 10 "Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

When we are fearful to to share our faith because we may lose family or friends 11 "Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account.

Church, in the midst of our doubts and fear let us remember whose hands our futures are in, and how he has been faithful long before our time:

12 Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

When you find yourself in seasons of doubt, hold fast to the everlasting blessings that God has promised you. These blessings are signs that despite knowing your deepest transgressions and doubts, God is faithful to love you more deeply and faithfully than any of us could ever imagine.
