#### 0:00 Call to Worship - Colossians 1:15-17

Whether you are new to Antioch or you've been here for years, one thing we hope that you experience is a deep sense of belonging. Not just because you like the music or the preaching, but because Jesus Christ is drawing you to himself and to his people. Indeed, he is the only One who can satisfy such a desire, and here's why:

"15 He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. 16 For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. 17 And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together."

Colossians 1:15-17

We haven't gathered this morning to worship the Creator of SOME things, the Lord of SOME thrones or dominions, the God to whom SOME things belong and SOME things hold together. No!—we have come to worship Jesus Christ, by whom ALL things were created, ALL things hold together, to whom ALL things belong!

And that includes you. So get in on this as we sing! You belong.

#### 0:00 Confession - Deuteronomy 8:17-18

Church, we live in a culture where ownership is one of our deepest values and sources of security. Yet hear this word of warning that comes from Deuteronomy 8:

17 Beware lest you say in your heart, 'My power and the might of my hand have gotten me this wealth.' 18 You shall remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your fathers, as it is this day. Deuteronomy 8:17-18

It's so easy for us to assume that it is only our hard work that secures the blessings of wealth and success. And then we fail to remember that everything we have is on loan from our Creator: the health, intelligence, circumstances, opportunities, talents, and even the luck that we have—it all comes freely from God. And one day we will give an account of how we've used it.

Let's heed this warning and go to Lord. Take the words of Deuteronomy on the screen and use them to offer your own confession to him. For example, you might say something as simple as, "Lord, please don't let me forget you." [brief pause]

Thanks be to God, who hasn't just confirmed his old covenant, but has given a new one for sinners to be forgiven!

## 0:00 Evidence of Grace - 1 Timothy 3:8-13

At Antioch we define the biblical office of deacon as a man or woman who is a lead servant in a ministry of the church. That includes five overarching elements:

- 1) They serve as people who are devoted and reliable
- 2) They administer by carrying out the vision of the pastors
- 3) They empower by mobilizing other members to serve
- 4) They mediate by keeping the peace
- 5) They advocate by representing the needs of their ministry

Deacons must be qualified according to 1 Timothy 3:8-13:

8 Deacons likewise must be dignified, not double-tongued, not addicted to much wine, not greedy for dishonest gain. 9 They must hold the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. 10 And let them also be tested first; then let them serve as deacons if they prove themselves blameless. 11 Their women likewise must be dignified, not slanderers, but sober-minded, faithful in all things. 12 Let deacons each be the husband of one wife, managing their children and their own households well. 13 For those who serve well as deacons gain a good standing for themselves and also great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus. 1 Timothy 3:8-13

At Antioch new deacons may be added after being nominated by members of the body or the pastors. After examination and consideration by the pastors, deacons can then be affirmed by a consensus vote of the pastors.

On behalf of the pastors I am excited to present Timothy Wallis to you as the deacon of facilities.
