Sunday Gathering

September 24, 2023 - Unimpressive but Authentic, 2 Corinthians 3:7-18 - Tanner Williams

Call to Worship - Exodus 33:18-19

"Please show me your glory" - this is the plea to God of a hundred different worship songs. It's also what Moses asks God after Moses meets Him on a mountain after the people of Israel make an idol out of gold and break their covenant with God. After Moses, enraged, shatters the tablets that held the words given to him by God for the people. Moses is asking to see God again after sinfulness was on full display.

God's response to Moses's request is this:

And he said, "I will make all my goodness pass before you and will proclaim before you my name 'The Lord.' And I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will show mercy on whom I will show mercy. Exodus 33:19

So God hides Moses in the cleft of a mountain, covers him with His hand so Moses is protected from the full weight of God's glory, and passes by him. And Moses beholds the glory of God.

When God's people ask Him for more of Himself, the answer is always yes. Even after wandering in brokenness and sin. This morning, let's invite the Lord to do his work in us today.

Let's repeat after Moses together:

Please show me Your glory. (Exodus 33:18)

Praise Him Praise Him (Lifeway)

Confession - Exodus 33-34

The glory of God makes us uncomfortable. He is utterly set apart from anything else - above everything else. It is supernatural and awesome. In fact, when Moses comes down from being with God on the mountain, his face is radiant, literally shining as a sign that he was in God's direct presence. The glory of the Lord visibly authenticated Moses as someone set apart for God's work.

But Israel's response was fear and discomfort. So much so that Moses veils his face around his friends, family, and neighbors.

I wonder then how we are tempted to avoid the glorious work the Lord has for us because it will make us look different or separate. Will you pray the underlined portions with me out loud?

Instead of walking openly in the path You have for me, Lord, I find myself wanting to compromise and blend in with the world around me. Forgive us. We know you are faithful to do this.

Would you open our eyes to see your glory? Would you make our hearts want to be filled with your presence at the expense of everything else?

Make me like You, Father, and fill me with bold love for You that shapes my steps toward authenticity.
